WELCOME SPRING

March is the third month of the year in both the Julian and Gregorian calendars. It is the second of seven months to have a length of 31 days.

In the Northern Hemisphere, the meteorological beginning of spring occurs on the first day of March. The March equinox on the 20 or 21 marks the astronomical beginning of spring in the Northern Hemisphere and the beginning of autumn in the Southern Hemisphere, where September is the seasonal equivalent of the Northern Hemisphere's March.

Q- What is the resident capacity at the Argyle?

A- The Argyle Assisted Living has 137 rooms and has a capacity of 140 residents. With questions concerning building capacity, please contact Jeromy O'Neil, Director of Sales and Marketing.

Q- Why are walkers being removed from the first-floor dining area during dining services?

A- All resident walkers are removed from the dining area for the safety of residents and staff. If residents have question's about walkers in the dining room, please contact Lesha Duran, Resident Life Director.

Q- Where are the nurse call pull cords in the dining areas?

A- The first-floor dining area pull cords are located at either side of the entrance. The Raleigh Gardens dining area pull cord is to the right of the kitchen door. If residents have any questions surrounding the nurse call pull cords system, please contact John Sliz, Director of Environmental Services.

Q- What activities are held in Raleigh Gardens?

A- All activities on Monday are held in Raleigh Gardens. Also, all resident meetings and councils, every other month, will be held in Raleigh Gardens. For questions about activities, please contact Samantha Steers, Activities Supervisor.

Q- What is the difference between a caregiver and a QMAP?

A- Caregivers assist with hygiene and housekeeping in resident's rooms. QMAP stands for Qualified Medication Administration Personnel. QMAPs administer resident medications and assist medically as necessary. For questions surrounding caregivers, please contact Lesha Duran. For questions concerning QMAPs, please contact DeAnn Vickles, Associate Executive Director.

Q- Why did resident's shower and deep clean days change?

A- Shower and deep cleaning schedules were adjusted due to the growing community. Those resident's that require assistance with showers now have their deep cleaning day on the same day as one of their two shower days.
