

Q: What do I do if my apartment was not cleaned?

A: If your apartment was not cleaned, please notify the front desk and complete a Resident Grievance Form so we can promptly follow up. After each cleaning, an Argyle Housekeeping Card will be left in your apartment to confirm service. If housekeeping is declined when staff arrive, they will try to return; however, cleaning that week cannot be guaranteed. Please note that all residents are required to allow housekeeping services. Per our Resident Handbook, apartments must be kept clean and food properly stored to prevent pest concerns. For questions, please schedule a meeting with the Clinical Manager or Associate Executive Director.

Q: What do I do if I missed my scheduled shower?

A: If you did not receive your scheduled shower, please contact your care giver first. If they are not available then contact the Clinical Manager so we can promptly follow up. If a shower is declined at the scheduled time, the care team will make every effort to return later; however, due to scheduling constraints, that shower may be missed for the day. As outlined in our Resident Handbook, all residents are expected to maintain proper hygiene. If regular showering is not occurring, staff may approach and assist to ensure health and well-being. For the safety and comfort of everyone in our community, maintaining proper hygiene is essential. If you have any questions, please reach out to the Clinical Team.

Smoking at The Argyle

At The Argyle, the safety and well-being of our residents is always our highest priority. After thoughtful consideration, four months ago we made the decision to no longer accept new residents who smoke. This step was taken to ensure a healthier and safer environment for everyone in our community.

For our current residents who smoke, smoking will continue to be permitted only on the North Patio, which remains the designated smoking area. To enhance safety, we will be installing a monitoring system for the smoking patio that will be observed at the front desk.

Effective April 1, 2026, the North Patio smoking area will be closed nightly from 10:00 PM to 7:00 AM. Smoking during these hours will not be permitted. Residents found smoking on the patio during closed hours may be subject to disciplinary action.

Please remember: Smoking is not permitted anywhere else on campus. Smoking in the street or between parked vehicles is unsafe and strictly prohibited. Residents found violating these policies may face disciplinary action in accordance with our community handbook.

These decisions were not made lightly. Our goal is to maintain a safe, respectful, and welcoming environment for everyone who calls The Argyle home.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation as we continue to prioritize the safety and well-being of our community.
